

**LETTER OF NOTIFICATION**

Date: April 19, 2016

Re: Proposed Lake Management Program – Ludlow Lake

The Ludlow Lake Club, INC has applied with the NYSDEC to use the aquatic herbicide Rodeo (Glyphosphate) in late June-August of 2016 to control Spatterdock, Watershield and White Waterlillies in areas of the lake, thus improving water quality conditions as well as recreational and aesthetic values. The Club will use funds obtained through the Ludlow Lake Club, INC to acquire the permit and contract for an aquatic herbicide application for Ludlow Lake. The Program will be conducted under the supervision of NYSDEC certified personnel with the lake management firm SOLITUDE LAKE MANAGEMENT, NYSDEC Pesticide Business Registration No.16505. A NYSDEC permit application has been submitted for approval for the application of the herbicide Glyphosphate. It is anticipated that 6 spot treatment applications of up to 3.47 acres will take place between June 15<sup>th</sup> and August 31<sup>st</sup> 2016. Notification of the actual date of the treatment will be submitted to the Lake Ludlow Club, INC and NYSDEC 7 days prior to application and will be posted along the shoreline on the day of the application. The roads along the lakeshore and downstream state access points will be posted at the time of the treatment indicating applicable water use restrictions.

Water use restrictions are as follows:

\* The water quality standard is 50 ppb for New York

\* To make aquatic applications around and within 1/2 mile of active potable water intakes, the water intake must be turned off for a minimum period of 48 hours after the application. The water intake may be turned on prior to 48 hours if the glyphosate level in the intake water is below 0.7 parts per million as determined by laboratory analysis. These aquatic applications may be made only in those cases where there are alternative water sources or holding ponds which would permit the turning off of an active potable water intake for a minimum period of 48 hours after the application.

In the event that you as a riparian owner or vested riparian user have any questions or objections to the proposed aquatic plant management program or water use restrictions, please contact the following agency within 21 days of receipt of this notice. Your objection must be in writing and demonstrate that your use of water will be significantly adversely affected (per the NYSDEC's policy). Lack of comment will be considered consent to the treatment and water use restrictions.
